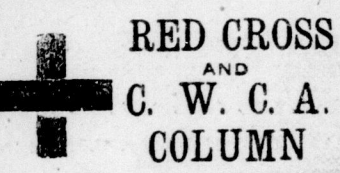

From a Returned Prisoner.

Here is an encouraging message for those who have adopted prisoners, or better still, for those who are thinking about giving a hand in this splendid work. It is an extract from a letter written by a returned Toronto soldier.

"With regard to the work done by the Canadian Red Cross Society in Germany, I shall cite my own case as an example.

"Taken prisoner on June 2, 1916, I was conveyed to a Stuttgart roller skating rink, which was being used as a hospital. Along with me were 30 or more severely wounded Canadians. We were the first Britishers to reach that city, and therefore had to live on German rations alone for two months and a half. During this time we were continually half-dead with hunger. The Canadian Red Cross Society was the first to find out our whereabouts, and by the middle of August parcels began to arrive from that society. Bread also was sent by them from Switzerland.

"Then men, who until then had been hovering between life and death, began to gather strength, while their wounds began to heal more rapidly.

"In addition to food, underwear, clothing, boots and overcoats were sent. These, especially, were badly needed, as we had no underwear, and only scraps of French and German uniforms with which to keep out the cold.
