NORTH TORONTO LIBRARY IS FORMALLY OPENED

NORTH TORONTO, Dec. 14.—(Special.)—The opening of the new public library took place here to-night when the library proper and the reading room were thrown open to the general public.

The new library contains about 800 volumes, which will within the next year be increased to 2000 volumes.

The only regrettable feature of to-night's gathering was the failure of the townspeople generally to turn out and see the splendid work which is being carried on by a few zealous and disinterested citizens, acting wholly from a public spirited standpoint.

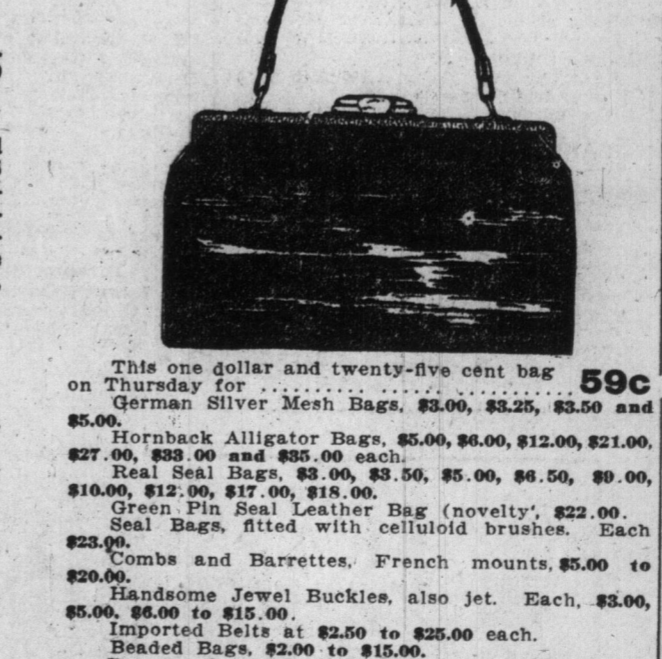
