Two years ago Ben Tillet, the or-gainzer of the London dockers, and the foremost fire-brand in Great Britain, rainzer of the London dockers, and the loremost fire-brand in Great Britain, was regarded as one of the greatest enemies within the empire. Today he is one of the most impassioned recruiting sergeants. He has been to the front in the trenches, and he has returned to tell in burning words the needs of the army and to urge slackers to their duty. At a speech delivered a few days ago at a recruiting meeting presided over by the Duke of Rutland. Tillet admitted that before the war he had a rather hostile opinion of the Duke and his class. Since he had been in Flanders his opinion had changed, and he stated that there were no braver, finer men in the world than the "nuts" as he used to call them, the scions of the British aristocracy, at the front. He concluded by paying a tribute to a young officer in the British army, a young man whom danger could not deter who was as democratic as any "Tommy" and who had set an example of devotion to duty that all might envy. The young officer was the Prince of Wales.

He had earlier requested that he should be sent, but Earl Kitchener had refused. Finally, when the young man had persuaded his father and his mother, the War Secretary consented and the prince.


