GIVEN THREE DAYS.

After a long discussion under a temperature of 90 degrees in the shade, the Riffians were given three days in which they might definitely accept or reject the terms offered. They were permitted to return to the Riff region by aeroplane to consult with their respective leaders.

Meanwhile the proposed conference which was to have opened here today has been postponed without date. Abe-El-Krim, whom both France and Spain refused formally to recognize as a belligerent or a peace negotiator; holds the fate of Morocco in his hand. Upon his decision to accept or reject the terms of the French and Spains traken to him by his delegates hinges war or peace. 




