Submerged City Found On Caspian Seafloor

Russian Captain Distinguishes Streets and Buildings of Ancient Asiatic Architecture Under Water; Town Believed Lost Kharadashgar, Overwhelmed By Quake

MOSCOW, Oct. 28.—The discovery of an ancient submerged city near Shikora, a sandbank of the Caspian sea, was made by Alexis Atayeff, a captain in the Soviet mercantile fleet.

Atayeff's ship, bound for Persia to Bakou, accidentally changed her usual course and while soundings were being made, he noticed buildings on the seafloor.

Atayeff asserts that under the bright sunshine, he was enabled to distinguish streets and buildings of ancient Asiatic architecture. A further investigation revealed a well preserved roadway leading to the Baku fortress.

Archaeologists are of the opinion that the discovery reveals the lost city of Kharadashgar, which is believed to have been submerged centuries ago by an earthquake which altered the whole coastline.

Atayeff's ship, bound for Persia to Bakou, accidentally changed her usual course and while soundings were being made, he noticed buildings on the seafloor.

CANADA ESCAPES IN FAIR DEFICIT; LOSSES UP TO GUARANTORS

Wembley Backers Expected to Find 75 Per Cent. of Guarantees; Dominion Only Liable For Pavilion; British Government Involved

LONDON, Oct. 28.—While the guarantors of the British Empire exhibition at Wembley are expected to have to find 75 per cent. of their guarantee, that is 15 shillings for every £1 guaranteed, no liability will attach to Canada in the matter of any deficit in connection with the big show. Canada simply provided her own part of the exhibition and paid for it practically out of hand; at least, she has involved herself in no further liability than that connected with the Canadian pavilion at Wembley.

The guarantors are those who originally made the exhibition possible by guaranteeing various sums, chief among them being the British Government, former Governor-General of Canada, and others guaranteed smaller amounts than the Government, but still amounts of considerable magnitude. Manchester and other large centres contributed large sums towards the cost of the exhibition, Manchester's guarantee totalling £100,000.

MIGHT HAVE BEEN WORSE.

While the liability resulting from the exhibition at Wembley is obviously heavy, the financial situation might easily have been worse than it is. The loss the first year of the exhibition was £1,800,000, but the loss this year will be considerably less than this. Many firms who offered guarantees probably have already written off a considerable portion of these. As to how much will be realized after the show closes will depend upon what the buildings at Wembley bring at the "break-up" prices.

Canada's initial expense on her own building was around \$800,000, of which amount \$500,000 was spent upon the erection of the building alone. To this must be added the salaries and general upkeep in connection with Canada's exhibits. The first year these totalled \$24,000.

The exhibition closes this Saturday.

RUSSIA TO HONOR SUN YAT'S MEMORY

Chinese University in Moscow to Base Teaching on Russian Revolt.

MOSCOW, Oct. 29.—The Soviet authorities have completed plans for the opening in Moscow in December, of a Chinese Memorial University dedicated to Sun Yat Sen, the "Father of the Chinese Revolution," and later an ally of Bolshevism, who died last February in Peking. Karl Radek, who had been officially designated the "Don" or head of the new institution, said that the university would train Chinese students in political and social sciences and would fit them for public service in China.

The history of the Russian revolution, events in modern China and general political history, will form the basis of their education, he said. "We shall concentrate our attention on social and political sciences."

SCHOONER IS SAFE

Maine Vessel, Reported Lost by Relatives of Crew, Reaches Nova Scotia.

PORTLAND, Maine, Oct. 29.—The five-masted schooner Edna Hoyt reported today as believed by relatives of the members of the crew to have been lost in the gale of October 10, is safe. Word has been received at Millbridge from Captain Millard Griffin, the master, that the schooner was blown off shore, but had reached Nova Scotia. She will proceed to Calais with her cargo of coal, shipped at Norfolk.
