ARMISTICE DAY ANNOUNCEMENT BY VETERANS

The Provincial Great War Veterans' Association have completed arrangements for the sale of poppies on Armistice Day in districts outside of the city. The Red Cross Branch of Campbellton is looking after Restigouche County. Women's Catholic League of Bathurst, will cover Gloucester County, while the Montserrat Branch of the G. W. V. A., will have charge of Westmorland, Kent and part of Albert. Northumberland County is divided between the Chatham and Newcastle branches of the association. The Woodstock branch of the G. W. V. A. will have control of Carleton, Victoria and Madawaska. Fredericton branch will have a portion of York County, Sumbury and Queens counties and the MacAdam Junction Branch will look after the territory near the junction. Charlotte county will be in the hands of three branches—St. Stephen, St. Andrews and St. George.

The Red Cross branches and Women's Institutes are co-operating with the veterans. The orders for the poppies by these bodies have been received by the provincial official and forwarded to the Dominion Command. The following warning has been issued by the Dominion G. W. V. A. and friends of the ex-service men are urged to purchase poppies on November 11, from bodies handling the vet craft in the poppy.

"It has been brought to the attention of the Dominion G. W. V. A. that commercial agencies are circulating branches of the G. W. V. A. and other organizations offering to supply cloth poppies for distribution on Armistice Day in memory of fallen comrades.

"There is only one source of manufacture from which poppies can be secured that will give full effect to the purposes for which Poppy Day was

instituted, and that is the Veteran Shops. The Dominion Command of the G. W. V. A. has the sole authority for distribution of Veteran Poppies.

"It may be well to remind ex-service men and women and the public generally of the three great objects attained by the distribution of poppy replicas on Armistice Day.

"The wearing of the poppy, emblematic of Flanders Fields, provides an appropriate means of demonstrating that the great sacrifice of Canadian manhood and womanhood during the Great War is not readily forgotten.

"Provides a means or re-establishment for seriously disabled men whose disabilities prevent them in engaging in work other than poppy manufacture.

"Creates funds for the assistance of disabled and otherwise handicapped

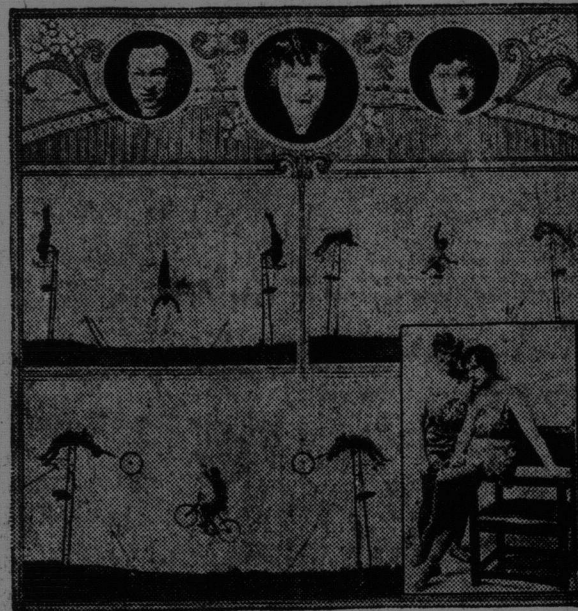

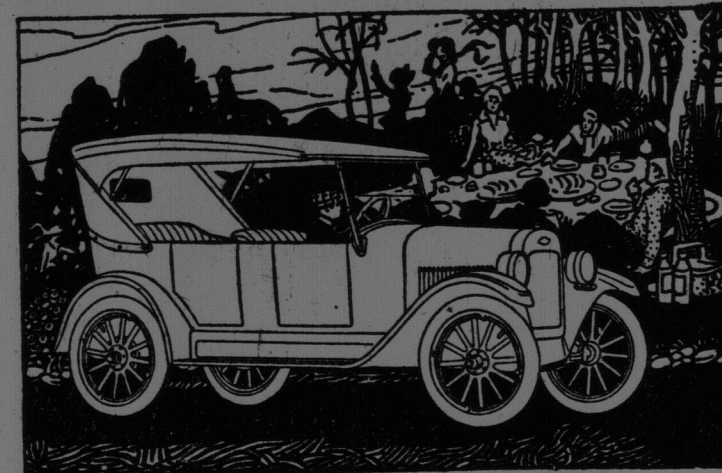
