#### REVIVAL IN BUSINESS

Canada in Better Position Than United States

(Montreal Gazette)

That Canada is recovering from the business depression which followed the war, and is now in a much better position industrially than the United States, was stated by Mr. F. D. Waterman, president of the L. E. Waterman Co. Limited, after an address to the members of the Y. M. C. A. advertising class, given in the Central hall last night.

Mr. Waterman stated that it had been the experience of many American manufacturers that their Canadian branches had done a larger proportion of business having a great deal of respect for goods manufactured under the British flag. Another advantage lay in the speed with which goods could be passed through the Canadian Customs.

In Canada, Mr. Waterman said, goods could be received from the Orient, repaired and shipped back in less time than they would have passed the customs in the United States.

Among the countries experiencing a notable revival of business in Mexico, said Mr. Waterman. Many American manufacturers who have been unsuccessful there for years are again sending representatives. "There are great business opportunities awaiting manufacturers in Central and South America—the people down there need many things, which
