## MILITIA MADE FINE SHOWING

Annual Church Parade Yesterday to Trinity Church and Cathedral.

Members of the various militia units stationed in the city attended divine service in a body yesterday morning, the Protestants at Trinity church and the Catholics at the Cathedral. They were in command of Brigadier General A. H. Macdonell and the martial music was furnished by the bands of the 3rd N. B. Heavy Brigade and the St. John Fusiliers. About 400 was the total muster, and they made an exceptionally fine turnout. The parade was witnessed by a large number of citizens.

The band of the 3rd Heavy Brigade was in the van. Next came the Headquarters Staff of Military District No. 7, under command of Colonel A. H. H. Powell with Colonel H. C. Sparling, Major W. C. Lawson, Major Thomas Pugh, Major W. H. Dobbie and Captain V. W. S. Heron. The officers and men of the 3rd Heavy Brigade followed under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel W. H. Harrison. Marching behind their own band and in command of Lieutenant-Colonel A. McMillan, came the St. John Fusiliers, and the No. 7 Detachment of Royal Canadian Ordnance Corps, under command of Captain John Larkin brought up the rear.

In Trinity church the soldiers filled the two blocks of pews on the centre aisle and, although extra seats were brought in, many of the congregation stood throughout the impressive service. Some of the beautiful Easter music was repeated by the choir. Special hymns sung were "Fight the Good Fight" and "Onward Christian Soldiers." During the taking of the offertory the anthem "I will sing of Thy Power," was rendered by the choir with Miss Louise Knight as soloist. Following the anthem while the congregation stood a short period of deep and reverent silence was observed in honor of those who fell in the great war. The National Anthem was sung afterwards.

Rev. Canon R. A. Armstrong, who conducted the service, took for the text of his sermon, the twenty-eighth verse of the fourth chapter of St. Mark: "The earth beareth fruit of herself." He spoke of the Easter message, not only the message of the resurrection to life immortal but the message of the ultimate triumph of righteousness. Christ, he said, sowed the seed of brotherliness and the harvest was a certainty. The hallowed fruit of those who slept in Flanders Fields, with
