Chicago, Sept. 2—"Pil stay with you, Mary." With these words, William F. Tanner, a cashier in the offices of the Baltimore and Ohio Railway here, closed his eyes, embraced his wife, whose foot was caught in a railroad frog, and was killed with her when a limited train on the Chicago and Northwestern Railway crashed into them last night.


