Dublin, Feb. 15.—The announcement that it is the intention of King George and Queen Mary to visit Ireland during the course of the present season, probably during July, has been received with the greatest satisfaction throughout the country. No details either as to the exact date or the length of the visit have as yet been published; but they are being eagerly awaited.

The announcement is made by the Dublin Evening Mail that a number of interviews will be arranged, in addition to those during the visit of their majesties. For this purpose certain additions are being made to the castle, which is also being redecorated and renovated.

It is further announced that their majesties will go into residence at the viceregal lodge when new rooms are at present being added in order to provide the necessary accommodation. Before leaving the country it is understood that their majesties will travel to the west of Ireland. Anxious to ascertain whether the royal tour, a telegram was despatched asking the question, to which, however, his majesty's secretary replied that nothing had as yet been settled with regard to the Irish visit.
