FIRST PHONE SUBSCRIBER IN COUNTRY IS TRACED

Preacher Agreed to Pay \$18 a Year for Service Back in 1877

New York, March 22.—Local telephone men have come across the first advertisement of a telephone company. It was published in July, 1877, in the newspapers of New Haven, Conn. This advertisement made it clear that subscribing for a telephone in those early days consisted in leasing an instrument and not in buying service as is the case now.

"The proprietors kept the instrument in repair without charges," said the advertisement, "and the user has no expense except the maintenance of the line. It means only a wire between the two stations, though ten or twenty miles apart, with a telephone at each end."

Despite this inducement and the further inducement that "the outside of the telephone is of mahogany, finely polished, and an ornament to any room or office," only one subscriber resulted.

The Rev. John E. Todd came forward and agreed to pay \$18 a year for a telephone. He is believed to be the first subscriber in the world to a commercial exchange.

According to several telephone officials the trouble was not with the advertising nor with the matter of stringing lines. The public simply had to be shown that it could not get along without telephones. Therefore, the records show a canvasser was sent out to make personal explanation of the telephone and 200 contracts were obtained. The

ENEMIES OF VERDUN MEET BY CHANCE IN THE RUHR

Dusseldorf, Feb. 20.—(By mail.)—A French captain, having lunch in a Dusseldorf restaurant the other day, noted that his waiter walked with a pronounced limp.

"Where did you get hurt?" he asked.

"At Verdun, sir," replied the waiter proudly and unconsciously coming to attention. "I was before Verdun for two months."

The captain became interested at once. A few more queries elicited the fact that the waiter, during seven days in March, 1916, had been in the German sector facing that held by the French captain's company. Trenches had completely disappeared, and the men of both armies were hidden in shell holes in some places less than ten yards apart. The waiter had taken part in a furious assault upon the captain's lines one day at dawn. Twenty-five per cent. of his company had been killed, wounded or made prisoners.

SWEDISH HOBOS MUST GO TO WORK OR JAIL, IS PLAN

Three-Year Sentence at Enforced Labor Urged by Legislative Committee.

Stockholm, Feb. 25.—(By mail.)—Habitual hobos in Sweden will, hereafter go to work or be sentenced to enforced labor for two or three years, if the recommendations submitted by the Government Committee on Legislation for the Care of the Poor are adopted.

This committee, which has been at work several months, has made a thorough-going social and statistical study of tramps, organized vagrants, gypsies and other anti-social types in the country and now suggests penal laws designed to make good citizens of persons in the classes named.

According to the proposed laws a person liable to arrest as a vagrant must take such constructive steps as trying to find work and lodging for the vagrant. This may be done through local employment bureaus, poor houses and municipal institutions of similar type. If the person reverts to vagrancy and again makes himself liable to arrest, he may be sentenced to enforced labor for three years. For good behavior the culprit may be released upon probation and will be helped to establish himself in a gainful occupation.

The committee further recommends that women be treated as vagrants, though it is held that every effort should be made to redeem them to orderly life through the work of social institutions, especially organized for this purpose.
