Instead of trying to fly over the mathematical north pole, they will aim for the inaccessible pole 400 miles from the centre of the north pole, and believed to be in the centre of a huge ice field. When any one first crosses the Arctic, most of the anticipated terrors will be found to be imaginary, and individuals and nations will begin to make use of the Arctic as the shortest route between many of the important centres of population."

Should land be sighted at the inaccessible pole, the filers will circle it and immediately return to Point Barrow, to report it. If no land is found, they will continue to Spitzbergen.




