ANNIE E. PAINE. A Hunter Lost in a Fog in Behring Sea Sues for Wages.

Stipendiary Magistrate Macrae, sitting in the provincial police court, gave judgment in the complaint of Butcher vs. Marvin & Co., owners of the sealing schooner Annie E. Paine.

On the 13th day of February last the complainant, Butcher, shipped as a seaman on the schooner Annie E. Paine, at \$30 a month. On April 25th he with a hunter left the schooner on a boat for the purpose of hunting seals.

Mr. Perry Mills, who appeared for the defendant, argued in the first place that the contract was divisible and the wages became vested monthly (Butter vs. Thompson). Marvin & Co. were willing to pay complainant for the time actually served until he was lost at sea.

The magistrate, having taken time to consider, decided that justice would be done by paying the complainant for services actually performed by him and gave judgment for \$31.10.

After delivering judgment the magistrate congratulated Mr. Davey on the able manner in which he conducted the complainant's case.
