

THIS LETTER HAS BEEN SENT

a, April 10th, 1896.

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that application has been made by the Indians of St. Peter's Reserve to have the base of the inner two miles, as defined by the Act of 1874, retraced, and posts placed to mark starting points of the division lines of the lots, but without running the said lines to the two miles limit.

Also to have that part of the Reserve which is beyond the two miles subdivided, including the retracing of the Townships 14 and 15, Range 4, east, which have already been defined, but have become almost lost.

The Agent suggests that the part to be subdivided iron posts should be placed at the centres of sections, as well as corners and half miles.

The Department would, if funds admit, undertake the work, either by sending one of its own surveyors or by engaging the services of some other, and it requests that in any arrangements you may be able to bear this in mind, when it is known what will be done, and what Mr. Assistant Surveyor is to do.
