## Chis Corner Stone of St. Peter's Church,

North Augusta, was laid by W. W. Bro. J. A. Henderson, D. C. L., Q. C., Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of A. F. and A. M. of Canada, Assisted by

The scroll and copies of the leading newspapers were deposited in the cavity of the stone.

The Rev. A. Coleman, B. A., the incumbent of St. Peter's Church, then addressed the Acting Grand Master and said:

MOST WORSHIPFUL SIR, -On behalf of the congregation of St. Peter's Church, North Augusta, I present you with this trowel as a testimonial of our esteem for you personally and in commemoration of the important work to which you have kindly lent your assistance this day.

The trowel was then presented to the Acting Grand Master, who on receiving it said: He received the trowel with pleasure and accepted it as a memento of the good work so happily begun.

The necessary mortar being laid, the Acting Grand Master spread it with the trowel and said: I spread this cement as an emblem of peace and good will, which I trust will ever prevail in the sacred edifice to be erected, and may its heavenpointed spire remind the congregation, under God's blessing, of those mansions of bliss whence all goodness emanates.
