Les touristes américains se montrent souvent des sabots portés par les paysans de France. Il n'y a là rien de risible. Le sabot n'est pas seulement une chaussure économique bien des notes de médecine, car il tient les pieds chauds et secs. La blouse aussi l'hilarité des voyageurs du Nouveau Monde; en fait, elle est parfaitement logique pour les travailleurs de la campagne; elle protège ou épargne les autres vêtements; et, en outre, celui qui la porte n'a jamais l'apparence débâillée. Pour l'éclairer, c'est un effet aussi pratique que propre et commode.

Il est au peine besoin de rappeler les économies réalisées en cuisine par une utilisation judicieuse des restes. Prenons par exemple le traditionnel pot-au-feu. Après huit heures de cuisson, le bouillon est délicieux; sur le garde pour plusieurs jours dans des pots de terre. Le premier jour, la viande de boeuf, ou "bouilli", naturellement assez desséché par l'opération, est servie accompagnée des légumes du pot-au-feu, auxquels s'ajoutent du rafiot et de la moutarde, ou encore une sauce "poivrade". Le lendemain, le reste du bouilli, avec adjonction d'"chair à saucisse", sera à confectionner d'excellents "boulettes", qui se mangent avec des pommes de terre. Très souvent, le lendemain, les boulettes qui restent sont mangées froides avec des œufs durs. Et il n'est pas du tout rare qu'un restant de cette viande apparaisse à souper, le quatrième jour, sous la forme de galettes sautées dans la poêle!

Personne ne dépense en plats sucrés autant que cela se fait en Amérique. La "tarte" et la "tourte", les puddings gâteaux, etc., sont exceptionnels, pour les fêtes, ou les jours où l'on a du monde à dîner. En fait, la majorité des ménagères ou des cuisinières ne savent pas faire ces sucres, sauf les crèmes, renversées ou autres.

A l'occasion, l'on achète les tartes, tartinettes, etc., chez le confiseur; mais plus généralement, le dessert consiste en fromage, fruits, noix—ce qui est plus simple, plus sain et moins coûteux. Jamais il ne viendrait à l'idée de servir, avec la viande, plusieurs légumes; un seul, abondant, mais bien cuit, est suffisant. Fréquemment il est même remplacé par une de ces salades dont il existe une variété en France.

Ne saute-t-il pas aux yeux que nombre de ces procédés pourraient se copier au Canada pour le plus grand bénéfice de la bourse et de l'hygiène?


