EDMUNDSTON TO ONTARIO **BOULEVARD**

Big pian of highway construction under study would transform high way of such length into modern boulevard.

Quebec, Sept. 4. — Study of plans for the construction, inco-operation with the Federal Government, of the trans-Canada highway, is now being made by engineers of the pro-vincial road department. The plans, as suggested, would mean the transforming into a mod-gern boulevard of a highway from

ern boulevard of a highway from Edmundston, N. B., through Riviere du Loup. Levis, Quebec, Montreal, and Hudson Heights to the Ontario

line.

This highway, the cost of which would be paid 50-50 by the Federal and Provincials governments, would be paved on a width of over 20 feet and would be in concrete or cement.

The plans if carried out, would mean that the necessar yalteration to transform the present highways into such a boulevard would be started without delay.

RECIPES

CORNMEAL FLAPJACKS 1 cup cornmeal.
