Fredericton, March 16.—If the present plan is carried out—and it is believed it can be—the Legislature will be prorogation will not be reached until that evening, but the present proposal is to make it possible for the members to leave for their homes by Thursday meraing's trains.

The committees of the Legislature have their work so well along that there is every reason to believe that the plan for prorogation on Wednesday can be carried out. The Corporations Committee have all their work leaned up except three bills, the Municipalities Committee have but four bills still to be settled, the Law Committee have two bills still awaiting decision and, the Committee of the whole House had all its business done at algournment Friday evening.

The Provincial Government was in session here Saturday, and in the morning heard delegations. W. A. Ewing, of St. John, appeared on behalf of the Union Club, St. John, and asked that the Liquor License Act be so amended as to provide for the issuing of licenses for clubs. J. Willard Smith of St. John, appeared on behalf of the Dominon Alliance branch in New Brunswick, in opposition to the proposal, and Hon. John E. Wilson is in receipt of a telegram from the officers of. the Dominon Alliance endorsing Mr. Smittl's position. No decision was announced. The Government also heard the members for Gloucester regarding several matters affecting their county.

What is Easter without the likes? Why, very much like Easter without the Bunny Rabbits and the rainbow eggs, I suppose. But let's not think of that kind of an Easter, with a fresh wilderness of the fair white bells coming in every day and enough colored eggs to gladden the heart of every small boy and girl.

Easter lilies, in the larger and more plentiful sense of the word, come from Bermuda. Under the clear Southern sky they grow as luxuriantly as do our dandelitons. Any one with lawn mower proclivities will tell you dandelitons are the limit of luxuriance. In Bermuda the natives gather illies by the armful and take them to market, where they sell them for export to "the States." Imagine going out into the field and gathering an armful of Easter lilies. In "the States" we are lucky to have a single bloom.

In order to present them to us fresh and fragrant, the blossoms are picked before they are fully open. The lity spikes are wrapped in a kind of gray moss which keeps them damp and fresh, a hundred to two hundred in a box. Fifty thousand of these flowers of rare perfume are often contained in a single cargo.
