WHAT WAR WILL RUSSIA GIVES COST CANADA * FOR NEXT YEAR

Expenditure estimated at Anglo-Russian protection between 200 and 250 will be withdrawn if Persia links up with Germ-Millions for 1916-Fiany and Turkey, nancial report for seven

Petrograd, Nov. 3, via London—Russia has notified the Persian government that the Anglo-Russian convention, providing for the maintenance of Persian integrity and independence, will at once lapse, if the rumors prove tween two hundred and two hundred and two hundred and fifty million dollars. Up to the end of this year the expenditure will be \$150,000,000 so that by the end of 1916 it will be about \$400,000,000. A statement issued by the finance department today says that about one thous and dollars per man per annum is calculated as the cost of raising, equipping and maintaining Canadian troops at the front and under arms in Canada.

In this war the estimates will be a continued to the present cabinet but to any Persian government that should think of linking the fate of its nation with that of countries at war with Russia.

In this war the estimates will be exceeded on account of the enormous explainture of ammunition and the heavy strain upon artillery and rifles. The annual interest charge in connection with the war expenditure by Canada to the end of 1916 will amount to over fifteen million dollars. The financial return of the first seven months of the present fiscal year, that is to say up to the end of October, shows an increase in receipts of \$6,700,000 over the corresponding period of the previous year and a reduction of nearly nine million dollars in ordinary expenditure and of two and a half million dollars on capital account.
