WHAT WAR WILL COST CANADA FOR NEXT YEAR

Expenditure estimated at between 200 and 250 Millions for 1916—Financial report for seven months shows gain of \$6,700,000 in receipts.

Special to The Standard.

Ottawa, Nov. 3.—Canada's war expenditure for next year will be between two hundred and two hundred and fifty million dollars. Up to the end of this year the expenditure will be \$160,000,000 so that by the end of 1916 it will be about \$400,000,000.

In this war the estimates will be exceeded on account of the enormous expenditure of ammunition and the heavy strain upon artillery and rifles. The annual interest charge in connection with the war expenditure by Canada to the end of 1916 will amount to over fifteen million dollars.
