**WILL BRING 25,000
TO CANADA THIS YEAR**

Brigadier Howell of Salvation Army
Says They Will Tap Scandinavian
Country.

Toronto, Aug. 27.—Brigadier Howell,
of the Salvation Army immigration depart-
ment, who has just returned from Eng-
land, says the army hopes to bring out
25,000 emigrants to Canada next year.
For the work 10 or 12 ships would have
to be chartered for a couple of trips each.
The army proposes to tap the Scandi-
navian country next year, and bring out
people from Northern Europe. This year's
immigration amounted to 12,000.
