ORDER TILLSONBURG—

Referee Had No Right to Order Overtime in Semi-Final Play-Off.

TILLSONBURG, Feb. 15.—Although Western Ontario papers state on their sporting pages today that the Tillsonburg senior N. H. L. hockey team lost the round to Woodstock last night, such is not the case. At full time the score was 3 to 1 in favor of Woodstock, making the round tie 6-5, but the referee ordered overtime, which was played under protest, Woodstock breaking the tie.

The local management at once got in touch with the legal officials and the tie has been ordered played off in the indoor rink on Wednesday night. A large crowd of local fans will accompany the fan drieds, who are confident they can put away the Woodstock team, and it is likely the winners will meet Niagara Falls in the semi-finals with home and home games, goals to count.
