

for. No printing as yet has been done. Salads and other roots are being used by the Indians. The salt supplied them being of great service in the way of cooking.

Nothing has been done in the way of getting out rails or firewood.

The health of the people has on the whole been good. No deaths having been reported. Warnings rather poor this month.

There is a steady but slight tendency towards civilization amongst these Indians. They are more cleanly than heretofore and their houses are nearly all now being improved and their manner of living is gradually becoming more like that of a white man than an Indian. Cooking utensils dishes & stoves are to be found in nearly all the houses.

Raised Beds are found in most all the houses with good beds and bedding and apparently clean and tidy. No partitions have so far been introduced in any of the houses on these reserves. Invariably open fire places are found in the houses. And now the whole way things are developing I have the honor to be
