
Sir,-

Chief Peter Angus and Angus Corinthe of Oka, who called at the Department yesterday, stated that the children cannot attend school owing to their need of clothing and the bad roads in winter time. The Chief stated that he had spoken to the Agent several times in regard to purchasing clothing for the children, but had no satisfaction.

The Department would like you to go to Oka and ascertain what children are in need of clothing and what clothing they require to enable them to attend school.

The Truant Officer also complained that some of the parents refused to send their children to school. It would be well for you to warn the Indians that their children must attend school regularly.
