- Q. How were you dressed when you surrendered yourself?
- A. Army clothing, sir, just the way I am now, without my gaiters.

Cross-examined by the Prosecutor.

- Q. How long have you lived at Albert Park?
- A. Since the 28th of November, sir.
- Q. Is that the little place you built awhile back?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Who was living with you beside the wife and children?
- A. That is all, sir.
- Q. Didn't you have your sister-in-law and your mother-in-law living with you for awhile?
- A. No, sir.
- Q. Is your house finished now?
- A. No. sir.
- Q. Did you work on it while you were away?
- A. No, sir.
- Q. What did you do?
- A. When I was away this time I didn't have money to work on the house so I started to dig a well because I have to carry water three blocks.
- Q. Did you complete the well?
- A. No, sir.
- Q. To what depth did you go?
- A. About mineteen feet, sir.
- Q. That is about a foot a day.
- A. That is about all I could do, sir.
- Q. Was your home quarantined while you were absent?
- A. No, sir.
- When you 'phoned your Company Commander at Currie Barracks, didn't you tell him that your home was quarantined?
- A. No, sir
