

- Q.57 The first time he appeared before you did you ask him if he had anything to say? What was his reply?
- A.57 Nothing to say.
- Q.58 I repeat that question. You asked him if he had anything to say and what was the reply?
- A.58 Nothing to say.
- Q.59 I submit, Sir, that his statement was "The same as the last six months my transfer or my discharge". "I don't want to stay in the Army, it has ruined my life already".
- Q.60 What was your reply?
- A.60 I said I knew of his case and, for that matter, a padre had also gone to his house. That is all.
- Q.61 What was your reply to his statement?
- A.61 I don't remember, although I might have inferred that he had accepted to remain in the Army.
- Q.62 You did not state "you will get your discharge, it will cost you a lot of money and you know Boyer, we know your double life"?
- A.62 I might have. I might have said that.
- Q.63 Now, when Boyer came up the second time, again you asked him if he had anything to say or have you any complaints? On the second appearance of the accused did you ask him if he wished to see his wife?
- A.63 Definitely. For information I asked him the first time also.
- Q.64 Did you also add a question: "Do you want to see your wife?" and before he could have an opportunity to answer add the words "You are not interested in..." or "are you interested"?
- Q.65 You cannot bring to your mind the exact words?
- A.65 Well, if you let me answer the question. During the absence of Boyer, Mrs. Boyer phoned me on a few occasions and you also have the evidence in the files that they were not getting along very well together. When he was under arrest and paraded to me the first day I asked him if he cared to see his wife. His answer was "no".
- Q.66 You did not put in any little clause immediately after your question?
- A.66 I might have added something. I knew of the case. He did not seem interested and I, as his O.C., felt his wife should be helped and I got him to sign documents so that his wife could draw some Separated Family Allowance and Marriage allowance to help her out.
- Q.67 When was this Separated Family Allowance application made?
- A.67 It cannot be made until one week after his arrest, but
