

Closing Address - Prosecutor.

Upon an order being given there are three witnesses who say the order was not carried out. Sgt. Slavich however is the only one who states the accused said "I am not going to do it" while the other two did not hear that statement being made. It is nevertheless quite possible the other two did not hear the statement being made and the case seems to me there was an order given while the question is was it or was it not obeyed. I feel quite justified in saying that the accused did disobey an order and should be found guilty of same.

Closing Address - Defense.

Lt. Sgt. Vorlich admitted that accused had cleaned part of the bench and Sgt. Halpinny stated that all he did was wipe off the bench that the re. assemble same. The accused had had work done on him by the dentist and was not feeling well. The fact that he did attempt to wipe off the bench does not show a direct disobedience of an order. Taking in mind the previous good service of accused I feel that there is sufficient evidence to find Sgt. Romanica guilty.
