Dear Sir:-

I beg to enclose herewith copy of a letter from Stewart Bros., Kincolth, with copy of my reply to the same. I note in your letter of October 29th last you state that the Kincolth Indians would all be home about the end of November and I think it would be advisable to meet them at once in order that a settlement may be arrived at and at the meeting the matter of the attached account might be dealt with.

It is assumed that Stewart Bros. are Indians and have a store and Pool Room in operation on the Reserve for both of which places they have obtained a licence. This is not necessary for Pool Rooms or Stores operated on Indian Reserves. I am enclosing two copies of regulations issued by the Department governing the operation of such places. From Section 2 you will observe that it is necessary to have the written consent of the Superintendent General, such consent necessitates application being made by the operator. I wish you would take one copy of these regulations to Kincolth and have it posted in a conspicuous place in the Pool Room fully explaining to the Indians all the conditions set forth therein.
