I have a statement ~~which~~ was not forwarded to the Commissioners while at Isawassen in regards to the two places I have mentioned in our memorial while sitting at our Reservation 1st. to a place as called by the Indians Ilakteness. as I have said we wish it to included to our Reserve, as it was the home of our Ancestors from time immemorial or as a camping ground when they are in quest of their living

2nd and to the next is the Sway-yea-molt Reserve now known to you as the City of N. Westminster Reserve. we know it belongs to us & it is where our ancestors use to make their home or a camping ground when in quest of a living such as hunting game or drying fish. we want all these to be confirmed to us Isawassen Indians & be delighted & be happy all the time in the future

In regards to this place at Ilakteness it was given to us by former Indian Agent Mr Tanner, about 30 or more years ago.

In regards to our low land at Isawassen, it was subdivided by the late Chief with the former Agent Mr Tanner. & was carried & passed what land was subdivided to the Indians is not to altered. & in regards to the portion of our Reserve called English Bluff, on the time mentioned above was carried & passed that it was a claim & every Isawassen Indian have an equal interest in the said English Bluff or Quapose
