In Ontario municipal law is the result of a gradual dev lopment that can be traced from the parish and Town Officers' Act of 1793 t) th · District Councils' Act of 1841 and the Baldwin Municipal Act of 1849, which gave us municipal government in the general form that we have to-day.

Notwithstanding these nu nerous statutes and the care with which they were enacted, every session of the Legislature results in some new development calculated to improve a system of local gover ment, s id to be "the best in the world".

SPECIAL LEGISLATION.

Municipal corporations are administrative bodies deriving their authority from the Legislature. They cannot do any act or make any contract or incur any liability not authorized thereby or by some Legislative Act applicable thereto. The necessary result of such a ru'e of law with t'e accompanying strict construction which is usual, is that municipalities often apply to the Legislature for an increase of power which it is desired to exercise. These applications are brought before the Legislature in the form of Private Bills and during the past-five years, 182 have been passed. They relate to almost every phase of municipal progress and mismanagement.

Most of the Special Legislation is to extend the borrowing power of municipalities. During the past five years, debentures, aggregating nearly Six Millions of Dollars, were authorized, being for :
