WITNESS Our " Trusty and Wellbeloved ALURED CLARKE, Esquire, Our Lieutenant " Governor and Commander in Chief of our faid Province of Lower Canada, and Major General commanding our Forces in North " America, at our Caltle of Saint Lewis in our City of Quebec, and " Province aforesaid, on the fifteenth day of December, in the Year " of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety two, and of Our Reign the Thirty Third.
