Having been found guilty of a breach of the privileges of this House, in having assaulted Jean Baptiste Eric Dorion, Esquire, a Member thereof, you have rendered yourself liable to such punishment as this House might award; and this House having ordered that you be reprimanded, you are reprimanded accordingly.

The Order of the House directs that you be committed to the custody of the Sergeant-

at-Arms, during the pleasure of this House.

The Order of the Day for the third reading of the Bill to regulate the means of egress from Public Buildings, being read;

Ordered, That the said Order be discharged.

Ordered, That the Bill be re-committed to a Committee of the whole House. Resolved, That this House will immediately resolve itself into the said Committee.

The House accordingly resolved itself into the said Committee, and after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Walsh reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made further amendments thereunto.

Ordered, That the Report be now received.

Mr. Walsh reported the Bill accordingly; and the amendments were read, and agreed to.

Ordered, That the Bill be now read the third time.

The Bill was accordingly read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.

A Bill to amend the Act passed in the twenty-seventh and twenty-eighth years of Her Majesty's Reign, respecting the granting of Charters of Incorporation to Manufacturing, Mining and other Companies, was, according to order, read the third time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. McDougall, seconded by the Honorable Mr. How-

land, the Bill was amended by adding the following, as Clause 2.

2. "The first sub-section of the first section of the said Act is hereby amended, by "the addition of the words, 'Printing and Publishing,' to be inserted after the word, "'mechanical,' in the last line of the said sub-section."

Resolved, That the Bill do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.

A Bill, from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to amend chapter 128 of "the Consolidated Statutes for Upper Canada, intituled, 'An Act respecting the Admin"istration of Justice in unorganized tracts,'" was, according to order, read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill, with the amendments, do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Legislative Council, and acquaint their Honors, that this House hath passed the same, with several amendments, to which

they desire their concurrence.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee on the Bill to amend the Act respecting the Superior Courts of Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction; and after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Walsh reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made amendments thereunto.

Ordered, That the report be now received.

Mr. Walsh reported the Bill accordingly, and the amendments were read, and agreed to. Ordered, That the Bill be now read the third time.

The Bill was accordingly read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass, and the title be, "An act to amend an Act respect-"ing the Superior Courts of Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction in Upper Canada."

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.
