HOUSEHOLD RECIPES

MUFFINS

2 eggs, 3 tablespoonfuls sugar, piece of butter size of nut, 2 teaspoonfuls cream of tartar, 1 teaspoonful soda, 2 cups sweet milk. Flour enough to make batter. Bake in muffle pans thirty minutes in a quick oven. G. B. R.

POTATO SALAD & DRESSING

Cut in dice 4 cold potatoes and 1 small onion. Half a cup of vinegar, 1 spoonful of mustard, salt and pepper to taste. One spoonful of sugar, 1 egg, piece of butter size of egg. Pour this mixture over the above. J. S. H.

SOUR MILK CAKE

One cup sugar, half cup butter, 2 cups flour, 1 cup sour milk, 1 teaspoonful soda, 1 cup seeded raisins and a small piece of citron, 1 teaspoonful cinnamon and cloves. E. M. B.

CANNED TOMATO PICKLES

One can of tomatoes, 1 lb. of onions, 1 pint of vinegar, 2 tablespoonfuls of sugar, 2 dozen of whole cloves, 6 chillies, simmer a long time. I. S. H.
