ATHENS' ASSESSMENT

It is evident to the most casual observer that in the matter of our assessment we are drifting into trouble so serious as to cause anxiety to all having the well-being of the village at heart. It has been said that no citizen objects to paying his full share of taxes, and we believe this to be true. The protest and appeal do not come until an inequality is thought to exist. Assuming these premises to be correct, would it not be well for the village council to take some steps to deal with present conditions in such a way as to obviate the expensive adjudication that now looms in the near future?

The whole assessment of the village has been appealed against on the ground that it is too low and not in accordance with the Assessment Act, and there are a large number of appeals covering individual cases. In the natural course of events these appeals will come up for decision before the village council, sitting as a Court of Revision, on June 3. The careful consideration and formal ruling in respect to each of all these appeals would take many hours, even days, to accomplish, and we think it is too much to ask our representatives to sacrifice so much of their time, without remuneration, particularly when we consider that, in all likelihood, an appeal would be taken from their court to the County Judge.

It is in the hope of relieving the council of much of their onerous work in this connection and avoiding the appeal to the judge, with the consequent heavy law costs, that we venture to offer this suggestion, viz.: That the council appoint a commission composed, if possible, of (say) five ratepayers, of whom two or three should be selected from the chief appellants in this cause, and that this committee should carefully revise the whole roll and report to the council in the form of a recommendation that certain changes should be made. While the council would not be obliged to accept the whole or any part of this report, the chances are that it would in the main prove acceptable, and the result would probably be the placing of our assessment on a much fairer and more equitable basis than it now occupies.
