Exemption Tribunals in all parts of Canada The local exemption ribunals will be constituted with the least delay possible, consistent with the selection of representative individuals to compose them, and the instruction of the members in their duties. There will be more than one thousand of such tribunals throughout Canada, each consisting of two members, one of whom will be nominated by a Joint Committee of Parliament, and the other by one of the Judges of the scienting Courts. Every effort will be made by the wide distribution of tribunals, and by provision where necessary for their sitting in more than one place, to minimise the inconvenience to which men will be put in obtaining the disposition of their cases. A Registrar will be applicated in each Province, who will be named in the proclamation and to whom enquiries may be addressed. Each Provincial Registrar will transmit to the appropriate tribunal the appli-

Men who do not desire to claim exemption will report to the military thorities for service either by mail or in person at any time after the sue of the proclamation. Forms of report by mail will be found in all at offices, and, like applications for exemption, will be transmitted free


