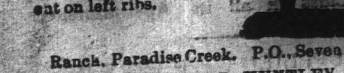

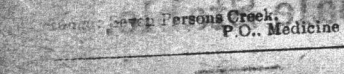

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

To the officers and members of the
Woman's Hospital Aid Society:
The following is a report of the
work done by this Society in 1905.

At the beginning of the year there
were 370 names on the roll since
then 50 new members have been ad-
ded, eleven resignations and two have
left town, leaving a total of 417.
Ten regular meetings were held with
an average attendance of 9.8.

The following are the receipts for
the year: Membership dues and con-
tributions \$246.90. Small dona-
tions \$29.36. Total \$276.26.

The following articles were supplied
to the Hospital during the year: 178
yards pillow cotton; 18 yards sheet-
ing; 24 yards rubber sheeting; 240
yards sheeting; 12 blankets; 2 rug;
down table napkins; 5 down covers;
56 pairs of night shirts; furni-
ture for Hospital, Nurses Home
and Cottage.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

Medicine Hat, Jan. 4, 1906
To the officers and members of the
Woman's Hospital Aid Society:
I have much pleasure in submitting
to you our Thirtieth Annual Report.
We have had a very successful year
though our attendance has not been
as large as we would like, due partly
to so many being away during the
summer months. We have a large
membership, and if more of our mem-
bers would attend, thereby encourag-
ing the faithful few, I am sure they
would be more interested themselves
in assisting so good a cause, suffer-
ing from humanity. When the Nurses
Home was about completed, as well
the addition to both General Hospi-
tal and Maternity, our Society de-
cided to assist the Managing Board
and assumed the responsibility of
the furniture which amounted to
\$200.00. We purchased it from a
traveller, Mr. Walker, through Mr.
Beveridge, and Mr. Walker gave us a
divan and reception chair for the
Lady Superintendent's sitting-room.
Mr. Morgan, of Winnipeg, donated
\$100.00, leaving a balance of \$510.00.
We paid \$300.00 from Nurses Home
Fund account which we had in Bank,
and the remaining \$210.10 from the
general fund.

Our February 14th entertainment
in the Opera House, a success, and
supper netted us \$160.00 which
was added to general fund for pur-
chasing linen etc.

Our Nurses Home was opened June
4th with a linen shower, or dona-
tions in money. We received generous
contributions of linen from both mem-
bers and citizens, a number of views
of the different buildings from Mr.
Beveridge, and some transparent
Beveridge.

The Nurses served afternoon tea,
and we had a musical programme.
Owing to illness, Mrs. McWhirter
has been unable to solicit for new
members as in former years, yet she
has enrolled 50 names.

Thanking both officers and members
for their kind assistance and courtesy
during the past year will bespeak a
continuance of the same for my suc-
cessor.

See January, Best That Took Place
in the World in 1905.
