Planes-Many Injured. Chicago, July 3.-One hundred fren-tied women and twenty men rushed panic-stricken from the three-story factory of the Western Paper Stock Company at Fourteenth street and Indiana avenue to escape being burn-ed to death to-day. Eight women were injured in leaping from the win-dows, and many more jumped in safety. It is possible some may have been killed, as in the excitement it was impossible to keep track of the occupants after they had left the blazing structure. The injured are : Anna Pretrosue, fell from third story window, back injured; Agnes Czne-wski, burned about feet and hands; Alberta Bienes, back injured; Arnees Soubada, overcome by smoke; Mary Barozki, feet and hands injured. But for the efforts of John Greg-son, an employee of the company, and James Hughes, an elevator conductor in St. Luke's Hospital, which is about half a block from the paper company's building, it is probable that may more of the frightened women would have suffered injury. These men procured a ladder when they saw the women leaping from the windows and rescued dozens. The building was burned to the bare walls. The damage was about \$100,-000.-

Might Have Been a Repetition of Le Bourgogne Horror. New York, July 3.-The French liner La Champagne, which arrived yester-day from Havre, just missed collision with the British freighter Iona, bound from Mostreal for London, on June 25th, about 200 miles southwest of Queenstown. It was about 9.80 a. m. There was a heavy fog and drizzling rait, and the liner was going at about half speed, sounding her fog whistle. Capt. Plorot and Cludef Officer DeMon-vei were on the bridge, and only a few passengers were on deck. They say that the freighter came out of the gioom 30 feet off the liner's port bow, without warning. The officers of both vessels held their course, which prob-ably was the best thing to do under the circumstances. The vessels passed each other, a passenger declares, port to port, with less than 25 feet of sea between them. Chief Officer DeMonvel says that the space was 75 feet, and that was hearer than he ever wauts to come to collision.


