In the Trentino region the Italians continue to force back the Austrians along almost the entire front, having made gion between the Adige and Brents Rivers, the Lagarina and Arza Valleys between the Posina and Astic Rivers, and along the Upper Bu Northeast of Verdun th French have recaptured more ground rom the Germans north of Hill 321 round Thiaumont Wood. Northwe of Verdun the Germans carried out a eavy bombardment against Avocour and Chattancourt sectors, but were revented from launching an infantry attack from east of Hill 304 by the ffectiveness of the French artillery re. In Champagne the Germans oc pied French positions near Tahure ut later were driven out. On the British front the expected big offen ive by King George's men apparently has not yet begun, but they are carry ng out at various points successfu raids on the German positions. The ombarding is heavy from the region f LaBassee Canal south of the Som me. In the latter region small British attacks were put down by the Gerans, according to Berlin. Continuing their counter offensive against the Russians in Volhynia the Germans captured the village of Linewka to the vest of Sokul and also have taken by tackers. storm positions south of the village Vienna reports further Russian attacks near Kuty in Bukowina have been repulsed by the Austrian forces. Between the Vardar River and Lake Doiran on the Greek-Serbian border artillery duels are taking place.
