Strangely enough the Cashin party on the other hand is built more substantially and it is towards this more substantial structure that the disgruntled section of the Squires party seen to be working.

The main difficulty is the fact that nobody wants to be the Government at the present time. The Country is faced with a shortage of over three million dollars in its revenue this year. The work of Mr. Coaker's Railway Commission has far exceeded the scope of the million and half dollar loan voted last year, and to add to that the Government has been unable to float a loan either in England or America. There is the increased cost of Members. Salaries. Departmental Heads, Fishery and Trade Inspectors, which will add another million or more. Thus the country is faced with a burden of between Five and Six million dollars over last year.

Further all extra taxation returns are reduced, and the Excess Profit Tax, for instance, will yield but a very small revenue this year.



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
