Stevedore Assaulted.

Morrie this morning with assaulting Mr. Bartlett, stevedore of Harvey's premises. The prisoner, who was drunk at the time, went to Mr. Bartlett on the arrival of the Rosalind and asked for work. As there were nearly 250 men looking for work and only 70 could be employed, Bartlett was unable to accede to the request. The defendant then threatened him with a knife and was later ordered off the premises by a police sergeant, but returned and again interfered with Bartlett. Through his counsel, M. P. Gibbs, K.C., Bartlett asked that the defendant be placed under bonds. He did not wish to prosecute the man as he had a wife and family dependent on him. The accused was bound over in \$100 to keep the peace.
