If any fish buyer thought well of it a want ad would bring, no doubt, a few who would be willing to try it. Then let there be an arrangement made binding the exporter to ship all A.1 fish as received under-if he so preferred-his own brand. As to the packages, there should be no difficulty in fixing about the cost. At present if an exporter puts fish in containers of any kind he certainly has to buy them, so whatever party found them they would not rest upon the fisherman's account as a real part of his expenses.

Of course there might be one obstacle in the way that could militate against the working out of such a plan. It would be hardly fair to expect from the merchant fancy prices in the first season even for fancy fish. 


