The Sugar Duties.

A large and influential meeting of wholesale grocers was held in the Mayor's office, at Toronto, on Thursday last.

Mr. John Boyd, the first speaker, presented comparative statements to show that the present tariff on sugar operated almost entirely to the interests of a couple of refineries in Montreal. The sugar which they import for refining purposes was of a very low grate, dutable at \$1.50 cm a higher grade, and on refined and sold, while the complained that this tariff was highly protective to the refiner, and argued that if a duty of about 1c. per lb and 20 per cent. ad valorem were levied, the wholesale dealers would be enabled to bring into the country a quantity of sugar superior to the refined article, which would cost the public less, and without any loss to the revenue. The commence of the country would also be considerably increased, and an immense impetus would be given to direct imports from the West Indies, which the Government profess a desire to cultivate. He concluded by moving the resolution—"That we are of opinion that the rate of duty on sugar imported into the Province should be changed from the existing tariff to the following rate: 1 per cent. per lb, and 20 per cent. ad valorem. Montreal, without doubt, will adopt the same. It is important that all should agree. Urge this on your meeting to morrow, and see the trade about it."

The resolution was adopted, and a committee was appointed to comfer with the Council of the Board of Trade.
