THE LIBERAL LEADER

Enthusiastically Received at Charlottetowas, P. E. I.

CHARLOTTETOWN, P. E. I., Dec. 24.—
Monday night saw the largest hall in
Charlottetown filled with one of the finest
audiences ever assembled in this Province.
Representatives from every section of this
island and from every class were present,
and hundreds were unable to gain admittance. As the Hon. Mr. Laurier, accompanied by Messrs. Fisher, Choquette and
the six island representatives of the Reform
party in the Dominion Parliament, stepped
on the platform the vast assembly cheered
enthusiastically. Mr. Fisher spoke for
reciprocity from a farmer's standpoint with
great power and was well received.

Mr. Laurier followed, and on stepping to
the front the audience gave him a welcome
of which any statesman might be proud.
He spoke for one hour and three-quarters,
delivering the most masterly and able address he has so far made in the Maritime
Provinces. One by one he took up and
disposed of the different objections raised
to unrestricted reciprocity, and his answers
were most effective. Quoting the trade
returns, he showed that over two-thirds of
the exports of Prince Edward Island go to
the United States. Elequently he appealed
to the people to compel the Government to
adopt a more concilatory policy, and in
scathing terms denounced the vacillating
and irritating policy which has driven this
country to the verge of commercial war
with the United States. Before he was half
way through the entire audience was captivated by his eloquence and logic, and when
he resumed his seat round after round of
tumultuous applause rose from the vast assembly.


