DRINK AND INSANITY.

Effects of Liquor Upon the Mind of Man.

The Moral Influence of Women — Do They Want Votes?—No Necessity of Alcohol as a Medicine—Address by Rev. J. S. Ross, of Woodstock,

It was a strong and vigorous address that Rev. J. S. Ross, of Woodstock, de-livered in the Adelaide Street Baptist Church Thursday. He is a speaker of excellent presence and clear, ringing voice. His points were made with clearness and snap.

"Just think of it," exclaimed the speaker, "in Canada 1,268 persons insane from the effects of alcohol, Supposing we placed them all in a village and called in Insaneville, what an awful object lesson this would be to us all!"
