UHLAN, BILLINGS UP, AFTER WORLD'S MARK

Owner of Great Trotter Will Attack
Major Delmar's Wagon Record
Today.

New York, Aug. 7.—C. K. G. Billings, owner of Lou Dillon, has gone to

Cleveland to drive his trotter Uhlan, 2:02½, at the opening of the grand circuit meeting there tomorrow, in an attempt to lower the world's record to wagon without the aid of a wind shield. The record is 2:03¾, made by Major Delmar in 1903.

Mr. Billings recently drove Uhlan a mile to wagon in 2:02¾, but the performance was made at an amateur

meeting and was not a technical record. Uhlan trotted a mile to sulky a few days ago in 2:00½, which is faster than any other horse has ever shown in public or private without a wind shield. Mr. Billings has arranged to bring the horse east after his Cleveland engagement and it is expected that he will start to beat the world's record to sulky during the New York grand circuit meeting, Aug. 23-27, at
