Fellow-Members of National Commission Vote Recognition Down-Opponents Have Month to Choose a Successor.

CINCINNATI, Ohlo, Jan. 9 .- Refusal of the fellow members of the National Baseball Commission to accept the resignation of August Herrmann as chairman means that those opposing him have another month in which to decide upon a suitable man for the position. The commission as at present constituted will get together for the last time in Chicago on February II, after which date Mr. Herrmann gave notice vesterday that he would refuse to serve.

The opposition to Mr. Herrmann as chairman is said to consist principally of five National League club owners. of five National League club owners.

Each league will hold its spring schedule meeting on the day preceding February 11, when playing schedules will be adopted. They will then meet together for the purpose of debating the question of a new chairman and deciding whether the minor leagues shall be admitted to relations under the national agreement again.

CHICAGO, Jan. 9.—Selection of a chairman of the national baseball commission to succeed August Herrmann, who tendered his resignation yesterday, probably will be made at the joint meeting of the two leagues, to be held here February 11. John A. Heydler, president of the National League, announced tonight. The committee of the two major leagues appointed a year ago to select a man for the commission chairmanship are expected to present their recommendation to the joint session, he said.
