



Claimed That Gas Supplies Are Ample To Take Care of All Requirements For the Next Ten Years — Strong Case Taylor. Taylor. The Porter, Will Be Made Out Against Companies.

WASHINGTON, July 8.—The House got under way today in its consideration of the Fordney tariff bill, Chairman Fordney of the way and means committee after reading of the bill had been completed in a speech of nearly two hours, developing the first phase of the Republican argument.

In his speech, Mr. Fordney discussed his party's attitude, what it proposed to do to remedy conditions and to help business.

Examination of the car showed the gear to be in neutral, thus throwing into question Gallagher's testimony that he put the gear from second into low and shut off the gas.

The verdict returned by the jury attaches blame to no one.

COST \$252,728,200

Engineers Report Favorably On Feasibility of St. Lawrence Project.

DETROIT, July 8.—Reporting favorably on the feasibility of the proposed Great Lakes-St. Lawrence waterways project and estimating the initial cost of making the route navigable to deep sea vessels at \$252,728,200, Col. W. P. Wooten, United States army engineer for the Detroit district, and W. A. Bowden, chief engineer of the Canadian department of railways and engineers, have submitted their report to the international joint commission at Washington that is in charge of the project. Col. Wooten made the report public here today.

The estimated cost is based on a channel depth of 25 feet, with provision in the permanent improvements for increasing the depth to 30 feet, if desirable, at an additional cost of \$17,986,-180.

80. Maintenance would involve an annua lost of \$2,562,000, the engineers esti-

cost of \$2,562,000, the engineers estimate.

The improvement program recommended provides for a series of nine locks, for 33 miles of canals, forty and one-half miles of lake channel, and 103 miles of river channel. The total fall from Lake Ontario to Montreal is given as 220 feet.

The engineers have been engaged in their survey for 18 months. They divided their problem into five separate divisions, each of which is given individual treatment in the report.
