AS A MANURE FOR ONIONS. Letter from Selby Lee, Warden, Shefford Co., C.E.

December 23, 1864. Dear Sir,-I used your Super-Phosphate upon my garden the past season with most excellent results. especially with Onions. For several years I have been unable to succeed with onions, principally on account of the maggots which destroyed them. This year I selected four beds, each 40 feet long and four leet wide, and applied 20 lbs. of Phosphate, putting part in with the seed and the remainder around the plants after the first hoeing. The growth was remarkable. I gathered 15 bushels of onions from these 4 beds, which contained 640 square feet, or about 2) square rods. They were seen while growing by large numbers of persons, who all, without exception, declared them to be the finest they had ever seen. There were also 25 good sized turnips grown on the same beds.


