INTERNATIONAL NEGOTIATIONS AND AGREEMENTS

The Fourth Protocol between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the United States, the United Kingdom and Canada, the period July 1, 1944, to June 30, 1945, signed in Ottawa, 17, 1945.

OFFICIAL STATEMENTS AND RELEASES CONCERNING EXTERNAL RELATIONS

Announcement of the visit to Ottawa of Mr. Lyttelton, Minister of Production in the United Kingdom and Colonel William, Minister of Food in the United Kingdom, for discussions with the Canadian Government of questions relating to the supply of essential commodities, particularly food - release of April 3, 1945.

Reply by the Prime Minister to questions in the House of Commons on voting powers in the World Organization for Peace Security and the participation of Poland and Argentina in the San Francisco Conference, April 3, 1945.

Reply by the Prime Minister to questions in the House of Commons on the Canal Project, April 4, 1945.

Statement by the Prime Minister in the House of Commons on the resignation of the Japanese Government and the denunciation by the Soviet Government of the Non-Neutrality Pact with Japan, April 5, 1945.

Announcement by the Prime Minister in the House of Commons on the appearance of the delegation to send a delegation to the meeting in Washington of a committee of United Nations to draw up a draft statute for the International Court of Justice, April 5, 1945.

Announcement that applications could now be considered for travel to France of two further categories of civilians - release of April 6, 1945.

Reply by the Prime Minister to a question in the House of Commons on the exchange of High Commissioners between Canada and India, April 6, 1945.

Announcement by the Prime Minister in the House of Commons on the names of the members of the Canadian delegation to the San Francisco Conference, April 6, 1945.

Announcement of the names of further members of the Canadian delegation to San Francisco, press release of April 10, 1945.

Reply by the Prime Minister to a question in the House of Commons on the representation of Poland at the San Francisco Conference, April 12, 1945.

Reply by the Prime Minister to questions in the House of Commons on conditions among Canadian prisoners of war in Germany, April 12 and 13, 1945.

Expression of sorrow by the Prime Minister in the House of Commons on behalf of the Canadian Parliament and people at the death of President Roosevelt, April 12, 1945.
