The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, today announced the names of the delegation which will be representing Canada at the fourth Special Session of the United Nations General Assembly to be convened in New York on May 14. The Canadian representatives will be:

Chairman:	-	Mr. Paul Tremblay, Permanent Representative of Canada to the United Nations.
Delegate:	-	Mr. W.H. Barton, Counsellor of the Permanent Mission of Canada to the United Nations.
Alternate:	-	Mr. J.O. Parry, First Secretary, of the Permanent Mission of Canada to the United Nations.

In addition, the Delegation will include advisers from the Permanent Mission in New York and from the Departments of Finance and External Affairs.

The General Assembly is convening in accordance with a resolution adopted by the Seventeenth Session to consider the financial situation of the United Nations resulting mainly from the heavy burden of expenses in relation to the major peacekeeping operations in the Congo and the Middle East and from the failure of many members to pay their assessed share of the costs. The Special Session will be primarily concerned with the problem of providing adequate funds for those operations for the remainder of 1963.

The session will be considering the report of the Working Group of Twenty-one on the Examination of Administrative and Budgetary Procedures. Canada was a member of this Working Group, which met in New York from January to February of this year.
